“With, of course, the recent payroll tax expiring and going back up to the 6.2 percent with all paychecks in 2013, all other issues have been stuck in congressional committees since the summer. The re-election and fiscal cliff has occupied all their time!

**Mike Belarmino** will keep a look out for any movement on any of our concerned acts or bills. It will be interesting to see what work gets done in Washington this winter, with debt ceilings, gun control and potential sequestering the main agenda. Hopefully, Mike will have some information or status updates on any given act by our March 1-2 conference, but there may be little changes.”

Please mark your calendars for the 2013 Annual Conference in Fort Worth, Texas. Note that the dates have been changed this year to Tuesday, July 16 through Thursday, July 18 so those who are attending the NACo Annual Conference will not miss any of that conference's meetings or events that run from Friday, July 19 through Monday, July 22. The NACCTFO hotel will be the Sheraton Fort Worth Hotel and Spa,

located a short 2 to 3 minute walk to the Fort Worth Convention Center.

The Wednesday evening event will take place at Stockyards Station, located in the heart of the famous Fort Worth Stockyards. Our dinner event will take place inside the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame Building. The Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame pays tribute to cowboys and cowgirls who have excelled in the sports of rodeo, cutting, ranching and those individuals who have dedicated their lives to promoting and preserving Texas Western heritage. The museum is located in Historic Barn A, in what was once the horse and mule barns of the Stockyards.



In the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame such greats as: Trevor Brazile, Tommy Lee Jones, Nolan Ryan, Barry Corbin, Matlock Rose, George Strait, Ty Murray, Lane Frost, Buck Taylor, Tuff Hedeman, Quail Dobbs, Buster Welch, Charmayne James, Don Gay, and many more are honored. Each inductee has their own booth containing personal photographs and memorabilia. Also within the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame are: the Sterquell Wagon Collection, the "world's largest lifestyle wagon collection," which showcases over 60 horse drawn vehicles (sleighs, buggies, carts, wagons). This exhibit provides a view of the past when green energy (horse-drawn) was the norm for all transportation. The exhibit includes a Sicilian cart dating

back to 1750, a Welsh hearse, and a variety of wagons that were used commercially and

privately; the John Justin Trail of Fame, which pays tribute to one of Fort Worth's own, who spent a lifetime building the Justin Boot Company and became one of the city's most prominent civic leaders. Also included in the display is a variety of boots, which were made for famous and not-so-famous customers, photographs of Mr. Justin, along with personal memorabilia; and three historical collections: The Chisholm Trail Exhibit, The History of the Charro Exhibit, and The Zigrang Bit Collection. These amazing collections contain original pieces showcased only in the museum. On permanent display, the collections are educational, and very unique.

In addition to viewing the Hall of Fame, we will have a real Texas-style Barbecue, then conclude the evening with a mystery theater production performed by "The Lonestar Murder Mystery Theater" actors and actresses, set in the 1880s with a full cast of western characters in a show that will leave you guessing "who dunnit" as well as roaring with laughter!

As usual, we will have our educational classes on Wednesday and Thursday, a Thursday Business Luncheon, and conclude with dinner and the presentation of awards and installation of officers on Thursday evening. ## **VICTOR E. MARTINELLI OUTSTANDING COUNTY TREASURER AWARD**

The "Victor E. Martinelli Outstanding County Treasurer Award" is presented annually by the National Association of County Collectors, Treasurers and Finance Officers (NACCTFO), an affiliate of the National Association of Counties (NACo), to a person who has been an active member of NACCTFO for at least two years and who serves as a leader in their home state and as a professional of the highest caliber in the operation of their own county office.

During the time period from 1965 to 1968 this award was known as the "Distinguished Service Award," and was bestowed upon a worthy

County Collector, Treasurer or Finance Officer who exemplified characteristics of leadership and professionalism. After the 1968 recipient Stella H. Spencer, the award was renamed in her honor. Until 1971, the award was known as the "Stella H. Spencer Distinguished Service Award". After the 1971 honoree Victor E. Martinelli, the award was again renamed in his honor. Since 1972, the award has been presented annually as the "Victor E. Martinelli Outstanding Treasurer Award".

A "Distinguished Panel of Judges" who are not affiliated with NACCTFO nor known to the

organization, selects the winner. The award is presented at the NACCTFO Installation Banquet at the annual NACo Conference each July. The nomination application is limited to no more than 1,000 words and no more than five individual attachment items, including letters of recommendation and/or other recognition forms. Non-compliant entries will be returned un-judged.

**NOTE:** Applications are due 90 days BEFORE the July NACCTFO conference.
