LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

From NACCTFO Legislative Chair Michael G. Diskin, Essex County, NY



Several legislative items of interest to NACCTFO members have occurred in recent months. First, there were several items in the **Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017** passed in December that affected the tax-exempt status of bonds. Tax-exempt municipal bonds have been an important tool for Counties to help finance long-term infrastructure and other public projects. Over \$3 Trillion of municipal bonds is currently in the bond market. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act **largely retained the tax-exempt status on municipal bonds** and Private Activity Bonds, which are widely used by nonprofit hospitals, universities, and airports. However, **Advance Refunding Bonds**, which were used by governments to save taxpayers money by refinancing one time during the life of the bond, **have had their tax-exempt status eliminated**. It is estimated that this could generate over \$17 Billion in new revenue for the federal government during the next 10 years.

As we all know now, State and Local Tax Deductions (SALT), with no cap on the amount deducted, had been allowed for certain taxpayers who itemized. State and Local income taxes and sales taxes, along with property taxes were allowed to be deducted. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act **capped the SALT deductions at \$10,000** for all those taxes combined. This caused many taxpayers to rush to their local tax offices to pre-pay their 2018 property taxes, creating long lines in many locations. Many counties scrambled to devise methods to be able to accept the advance payments. Late in December, the I.R.S. ruled that the prepayments would only be allowed if the properties were already assessed and bill for 2018. For many taxpayers, it meant they were not going to be allowed to use the deduction and those taxpayers began asking for refunds.

Finally, the **United States Supreme Court has agreed to review remote sales tax collection**, which could be good news for many states trying to collect sales taxes from internet sales. In 1992, the U.S. Supreme Court, in the case of Quill vs. North Dakota ruled that sales taxes could not be collected unless there was physical presence in the locality where the sales tax was imposed. As we all know, internet sales have changed that landscape dramatically since that time. A new case, South Dakota vs. Wayfair, has reached the level of the U.S. Supreme Court in 2018. The state of South Dakota seeks to collect sales tax on purchases made from sellers outside the state, and this will precipitate a review by the current Supreme Court of the 1992 Quill case. Should the Court find in favor of South Dakota, it should allow the rest of the states to collect sales tax from internet sales, even if the vendor does not have a presence in the state. After many years of trying to get national legislation passed, in various previous bills, this could be the year that sales tax collection on internet sales finally gets resolved. However, a court decision would largely leave sales tax collection decisions to states, and could leave counties on the outside looking in at new revenue streams. Congress is working to pass legislation, including the **Marketplace Fairness Act (MFA)** or the **Remote Transactions Parity Act (RTPA)**, that would ensure a role for local governments in this process.

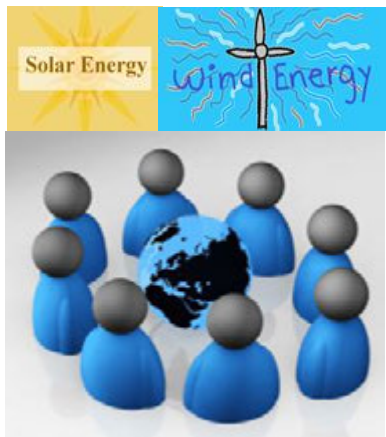
